Repairs and Refurbishments

Following reports in our last issue on a number of care and repair issues around the garden, we have made great progress in getting these resolved or moving forward.





Build Projects

The shelter planned for the corner of the north west quadrant of the garden, is also taking shape. We have completed the tiled floor. The stone bench has been built and is just waiting to be topped with a sitting surface which will either be stone or wood.

On the opposite side of the garden, we have finally got going with building the reclaimed stone retaining wall around the veg plot. Once finished this will extend our growing area in this quadrant considerably and enable us to start work on putting in new paths.

Cottage Repairs

The loose slates on the cottage roof were secured or replaced as necessary just in time for our 'Have a Grow' day. This meant that at last we were able to restore the opening of the south gate. Our thanks to Works and Estates at Aneurin Bevan University Health Board for their help on this.

The barge boards have new covers and the guttering and downpipes have been replaced. The timber arch and door have been repaired and undercoated ready for a fresh lick of paint. Replacing the windows will be next.





New barrow and pergola



We are very lucky to have such skilled and talented volunteers helping in the garden. Look what has been built! The costermongers barrow has been made from scratch and provides a great focal point in the centre of the garden and a place to sell our wares.

The new pergola is over the steps in the Mediterranean garden in the southeast quadrant. A grapevine is now making its way up the sides and who knows? Next year we may have grapes!

Ponthir Planters Project

This year Ponthir Community Council commissioned the garden to supply flowering plants for their planters that are set along the main road through the village.

A colour palette of soft greens, yellows and oranges was agreed. The garden team then selected suitable annuals and a few perennials, and grew then on from late winter.

In May, just before the Bank Holiday, the plants were all good to go. Volunteers teamed up with Brownies from the village to fill the planters with summer colour. The local community are doing the watering and weeding, to ensure they last through to the end of summer.
